ISAMBARD BRUNEL JUNIOR SCHOOL PE and Sport Premium Funding 2017-18

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for physical education (PE) and sport. This funding is ring-fenced and schools must spend it on improving the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision.

This academic year, the funding of £18860 will be continued to be used to fund specialist coaches to provide high quality PE lessons for children in all areas of the PE curriculum. Staff will continue to observe these coaches (in different areas of the PE curriculum) as part of their ongoing training to develop their skills to deliver high quality PE lessons in the future.

In addition, Portsmouth School Sport Partnership will run lunchtime clubs to encourage children to take up physical activity, introducing them to a variety of sports and team games throughout the year, including football, basketball, netball, cricket and athletics.

We are continuing to develop and embed the 'Real PE' curriculum which improves agility, balance and coordination. It aims to give all children the physical literacy, emotional and thinking skills to achieve in PE, Sport and life.

We will continue to develop our after school clubs to provide a range of different sports. This may include dodgeball, tri-golf, handball, football, athletics and tennis.

Children will also have the opportunity to participate in inter-school and intra – school tournaments and competitions throughout the year.

All children's sporting achievements, whether in school or out of school, are celebrated in assemblies to encourage and nurture other children to participate in sport.
